

Student Safety at Alberta Pianofest

Rundle's Mission, at Mission Beach Pigeon Lake, is an ideal location for young people to gather together for an artistic residency. In addition to being a scenic location, the area is very tranquil, friendly, and safe. Mission Beach is a small, quaint village comprised of families on summer vacation. As such, the lakeshore, village, and Rundle's Mission campus are ideal for providing a safe, secure setting, while also affording students the enjoyment of some personal freedom and independence during their stay.

Two camp counselors, one of each gender, will be on staff at the festival to supervise the twelve student participants. Counselors will watch the beach and campus, help to organize recreational activities, and sign in all students at 11:30 pm each night in their respective dormitory rooms. Any student who encounters a problem or concern while at the festival may address the issue with the camp counselors or the festival director at any time, 24 hours a day. The nearest medical clinic is a short 10 minute drive from the festival campus, should any student require medical attention while in residence.
